

Chapter VIII

Science of Genealogy

The Science and study of genealogy deals with the history of one's family pedigree. In reality, it is an accounting of the descent of a person, from a family group, then from a still older original ancestor, as far back as one can document. The dictionary adds the following four words to the definition: "or from older forms." The latter words suggests that the genealogy of humans may be traced back to non-human forms or animals. This question and issue has been dealt with in previous chapters and this writer stands on the premise that the scientific evidence strongly demands a finding that the descent of humans, is always only from other humans. A. Nos. 1-113.

Documents and sources were provided to me by Bates Block, attorney, and former State President of the Georgia Genealogical Society. The "Royalty Charts" was compiled for Lillie Belle O'Donnell, by Claudia Yewell Lindley, October 27, 1933.

Nos. 1-67 were found in the Bible. Nos. 1-102 were taken from chart compiled by Archibald F. Bennett, M.E., for the Genealogical Society of Utah. Nos. 93-99 were found in the book, Charles the Great, by Mombert. Genealogical table shows the descent and family of Charles the Great. Nos. 103-114 were found in, A Shorter History of England, by A. F. Cross. Other information included in this chart, but not all included in my genealogy was derived from the Dictionary of National Biography, Burks Genealogical Heraldic Dictionary and The Abridged Compendium of American Genealogy, Vols.
